

ENVIRONMENTAL AND CLIMATE ACTION

Farming is affected by climate change and environmental degradation

Farming can help to achieve EU environmental and climate objectives, COP21 goals and SDGs





ENVIRONMENTAL AND CLIMATE ACTION

- > Future green architecture
 - Environmental and climate **objectives** set at **EU** level
 - Member States set adequate targets in their CAP strategic plans
 - 1) Mandatory: all income support linked to environment and climate friendly farming practices = conditionality
 - 2) Voluntary entry level schemes going beyond conditionality
 - 3) Additional (voluntary) more ambitious agri-environment-climate measures (AECMs)
- Explore nutrient management plan for optimising farm income, protecting water quality and cutting greenhouse gas emissions from soil

RISK MANAGEMENT

Ideas for future CAP combining EU-level support with Member States' tools and private sector instruments

- EU-level platform on risk management (on DG AGRI website): single multistakeholder hub, generating and sharing knowledge, experience and best practices among actors, from farmers and public authorities (Commission = facilitator) to research institutes and private sector players
- > Explore:
 - Use of **financial instruments** (loans, guarantees and equity to support investments in physical assets and preventive measures reducing risk exposure - e.g. flood prevention - to facilitate access to working capital)
 - Support for re-insurance of mutual funds
 - Incentives for **precautionary savings** (reserve in good years for cash flow in bad ones)
- Training, knowledge transfer and farm advisory services
- Explore actions by Member States (e.g. taxation)

Article 12 Public intervention periods

Buying-in at fixed price within ceiling for common wheat, butter, SMP (beyond ceiling: by tender)

Tender for durum wheat, barley, maize, paddy rice, beef and veal







Aid for private storage


Eligible products
